

Health and Wellness

MAYO CLINIC HEALTH SYSTEM - EXPRESS CARE CLINIC

All students have access to an on-campus Express Care Clinic operated by Mayo Clinic Health System on the first floor of Luther Hall, adjacent to Old Main. There is no charge for student visits to the Express Care Clinic as student fees cover the costs. Students simply need to provide their current Bethany student I.D. card to receive medical services.

The Express Care Clinic is staffed with board-certified Physician Assistants or Nurse Practitioners from the Mayo Clinic Health System. These health care professionals are able to diagnose and prescribe medications for common conditions such as: strep throat, pinkeye, sinus infections, respiratory illnesses, skin infections, and the like.

The clinic is open every weekday morning from 7:45 - 9:45 a.m. while classes are in session. Located on the lower level of Luther Hall.
