The banners hanging in the Chapel today were created by Professor of Studio Art Jason Jaspersen and the Bethany Art Service. They were originally commissioned for use at seven different worship services during the 2024 Wisconsin Evangelical Lutheran Synod (WELS) National Conference on Worship, Music, and the Arts. Bethany Studio Art majors Lydia Kratz and Abigail Skorenkyi designed and hand painted six original designs with the help of other Art Service members. The 4'x15' canvases correspond with liturgical seasons. Four of the banners were chosen to complement this year's Christmas at Bethany concerts and represent a special collaboration between the Music and Art Departments.

Advent: Blue, shoot from stump of Jesse. Star promise symbol. The Gospel is surprisingly irrational. Life comes out of death...a shoot out of the broken stump.

Christmas: a collage of events in red. Players in familiar moments change scale. The drama of the incarnation plays out in the lives of simple people. The Word became flesh and dwelt among us.

Epiphany: Magi take action to investigate this star in the sky. Were these the remnants of the Babylonian captivity? God steers history in unlikely and unpredictable ways.

Easter: Lilies signal life and hope. Butterflies and stars emerge in background patterns. I am the way the truth and the life. First fruits of the resurrection. Jesus.
